However we may have voted in the Referendum, we can surely agree that the vote to leave the European Union has led us into a time of great uncertainty, and therefore anxiety, as a nation.



If we are currently experiencing some sense of panic perhaps we, too, have been placing more of our hope in material wealth than we were wise to do!

We should surely be looking for opportunities to share with people the confidence and security we find in belonging to Jesus Christ. In a series of Tuesday evening meetings at the Vicarage, beginning on July 5, we shall be following Lee Strobel’s six-part video course, *“The Case for Christ”*, which examines the evidence which leads Christians to being so confident in their faith in Jesus. Perhaps, too, having seen the quality of the material, some might feel that this is something they could also share in time to come with friends or neighbours.

The apostle Peter wrote, “**Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope you have**” (1 Peter 3:15). We should pray that that such hope will be visible in us and that we'll have many opportunities to share it with those around us.
