Dear Friends,

The suffering of our Christian brothers and sisters in many parts of the Muslim world has continued during the last month. This has included the horrific beheading by the so-called Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant of 21 Egyptian Coptic Christians on a beach in Libya.

Every time news of a fresh horror breaks, western leaders queue up to say that it represents a terrible distortion of true Islam. They are terrified, of course, of saying anything which might be seen as an excuse for any kind of backlash against the majority of Muslims living in the West, who are decent people just as horrified and appalled at what's happening as are the rest of us. This would be totally wrong, and they must be afforded the full protection of the law like all other citizens.

We should not be afraid, however, to ask the question as to whether the terrible things taking place are a distortion of true Islam, or whether, in truth, they are very much a part of true Islam, albeit a part that decent, compassionate Muslims would rather not acknowledge and do not want to act upon.

Terrible things have also been done in the name of Christianity in times past but the question we must ask of both faiths is whether what has been done is in accordance with the teaching and example of their founders. Jesus said, "**Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you**" (Matthew 5:44), and there is nothing in His example to provide anyone with any excuse for behaving otherwise. By contrast the website http://wikiislam.net/wiki/List_of_Killings_Ordered_or_Supported_by_Muhammad provides a list of Moslem sources for killings ordered or supported by Muhammad.

As one internet author puts "In fact, many Muslims are such kind, peaceful, and gentle people that they seem to be following the example

set by another great religious leader—one who died on the cross for the sins of the world and rose from the dead to prove his message." (<u>http://www.answering-islam.org/Authors/Wood/two_faces.htm</u>)

WHY DO I NEED TO BE ON THE ELECTORAL ROLL? What is the Electoral Roll?

It is a list of names and addresses of the lay people of the parish, who are aged 16 and over, and who fill the conditions set out by the Church in Wales [The conditions are set out on the application form]. The list is revised every 5 years and **this year every church member needs to reapply.**

Why does my name need to be on it?

Because only those whose names are on the Electoral Roll can:

- Stand for election to (if over 18), and vote for, the Parochial Church Council;
- Be eligible to be a Churchwarden and vote for the People's Warden;
- Vote for representatives on the Area Deanery Conference and the Diocesan Conference.

How do I go about it?

Complete, sign and date one of the forms available at the back of church then return it to the Vicar or PCC Secretary (Mrs Ann Phipps).

What then?

A copy of the Electoral Roll will be displayed in the church porch before the Vestry Meeting each year. You can therefore check that your name has been entered.
