Mike Clark, Scretary of the Church Committee, reports:

At its meeting on 21st June, a full gathering dealt energetically with a varied agenda. A paper on the 'Archdeacons' Visitation 2022' sought views on how to meet a diocesan target of moving to **net zero carbon emission by 2030**. Such questions had been considered by the Restoration Sub-Committee over the last two years, and all this led, later in the meeting, to discussion of the viability of the restoration ambition. As in previous meetings no clear mandate was given to the long-term aims, although no one wants to dismiss the idea entirely.

At this stage, Gordon Kilby, recovering fast from recent surgery, proposed that Chris Atherton, an experienced and successful Project Manager and Fund-Raiser, should be appointed for six months; Chris' work has transformed Picton Castle. Heated questioning took place, but since Gordon had already secured funding for this appointment, the Committee agreed to go ahead, pending the approval of the LMA Council.

Progress was also recognised, both in Roderick Davies' updating of the church website, and in receiving responses to the Worship, Pastoral, and Mission Subgroup's congregational questionnaire on service provision.

John Morgan, the Committee Chair, has worked to establish closer links with the LMA Dean, particularly relating to Faculty application for under-pew heating.
